CCNY to Offer Sustainability Masters

CCNY is developing an interdisciplinary Master of Science in Sustainability program to educate the leaders of tomorrow to solve problems stemming from the interaction between humans and the environment. The program, which is pending approval, would include classes from architecture, engineering, science and social science. Graduates will be prepared for a wide range of careers, including government, planning and design of buildings and communities, utilities, construction, consultancy, research and development and education.

Banerjee to Head New CUNY Energy Institute

Dr. Sanjoy Banerjee, an internationally recognized expert on transport processes in energy systems has joined the faculty of The Grove School of Engineering as Distinguished Professor of Chemical Engineering and will serve as Director of the new CUNY Energy Institute. This new Institute will serve as a focal point for CUNY-wide research initiatives related to energy production and utilization. Its initial focus will be on energy storage applications for the transportation and residential sectors.

MEDP researches, develops, and promotes recovery and reuse of material resources for the benefit of all New Yorkers. [New York Wa\\$teMatch](#) is New York City's materials exchange and solid waste reduction program, which helps NYC businesses, not for profit organizations and government agencies reduce disposal costs, generate revenue and obtain raw materials for free.
